Dear Sir/Madam,

As the Director of the RAAF Dog Handlers Association, RDHA, I am writing on behalf of the Association for those men and women that served as armed Security Force with Police Dogs in Butterworth, Malaysia and Singapore between the years of 1971 to 1989.

The roll of the armed Security Guards and Police Dog Handlers was to patrol with Police Dogs the flightlines of 75 and 3 Squadrons where RAAF and allied aircraft were parked and housed, protecting RAAF assets from insurgents. This roll also was extended to internal patrols within Air Base Butterworth and along the eastern side of No.4 RAAF Hospital and married quarters of Tan Si Gin and Robina.

These veterans were on A Grade posting for a minimum posting of two years.

The Rifle Company Butterworth had submitted the request to have their deployment recognised as "warlike" over a decade ago and at the time was not recognised. The Rifle Company Butterworth has now asked to reconsider a medallic recognition for Rifle Company Butterworth.

With this in mind, we, the men and women veteran RAAF Police Dog Handlers are asking if the Tribunal will consider whether these Australian veterans should also receive the Australian Active Service Medal for their deployment to Malaysia and Singapore from 1971 to 1989 in conjunction with the Rifle Company Butterworth.

Australian Defence Force personnel have served continuously at the Royal Malaysian Air Force Base Butterworth in Malaysia since 1971, when RAAF Police Dog Handlers were posted A Grade at a

time of unrest in Malaysia, led by the Malayan Communist Party (MCP) until the MCP signed a peace treaty with the Government of Malaysia in 1989.

I am sure the Tribunal would have relevant documentation submitted by Rifle Company Butterworth of which the RAAF Dog Handlers Association supports.

I have attached a copy of the Media Release from The Hon Andrew Gee MP dated 7th April 2022 along with my personal Record of Employment and Task Authorization extract where it is detailed of my service in both Butterworth and Singapore from 11th March 1974 to 11th December 1996.

INDEPENDENT TRIBUNAL TO RECONSIDER MEDALLIC RECOGNITION FOR RIFLE COMPANY BUTTERWORTH

The independent Defence Honours and Awards Appeals Tribunal will re-examine the issue of medallic recognition for Australians who served with Rifle Company Butterworth in Malaysia between 1970 and 1989.

Minister for Veterans' Affairs and Defence Personnel Andrew Gee said the Government had listened to the concerns raised by many veterans who had served on Rifle Company Butterworth deployments.

"The Tribunal will consider whether these Australian veterans should receive the Australian Active Service Medal for their deployment to Malaysia," Minister Gee said

"The issue was looked at by the Tribunal more than a decade ago, and a view was taken at the time not to recognise their service as "warlike".

"The New Zealand Government recently broadened eligibility for the New Zealand Operational Service Medal for veterans who served in Malaysia and Singapore between 1959 and 1974. Given this, and the concerns raised directly with me by the veteran community, it is timely that this issue is re-examined.

"The Tribunal is an independent statutory body specifically set up to consider honours and awards issues like this.

"I sincerely appreciate the many representations made to me and my office on this matter since I took on the Veterans' Affairs portfolio last year.

"I also acknowledge that veterans who have served on Rifle Company Butterworth deployments have been fighting for this additional recognition for years, and I don't want this to drag on. I expect the inquiry to be complete by the end of the year.

"This will be a public inquiry and I encourage all those with an interest to make a submission before 1 July 2022."
