called out for real and as the M 60 gunner I went to action, one male was detained, but I still sit up in bed some nights and wonder what might have been. * Malay choppers regularly returned to Butterworth full of bullet holes from ground fire, they parked next to our location. * The armoury was always manned by an armed guard 24hrs a day. * Lcpl Mills was killed outside the front gate, we couldn't go to his funeral, we never even had a memorial service and to this day I don't really know what happened to him. * I spent 10 days attached to a RAAF C130 crew on flood relief in Thialand, we moved 250 tons of rice and AV Gas to all parts of the country while no other aircraft could get off the ground. I am still waiting for my Humanitarian medal. In Australia we have a mean government when it comes to dishing out honours and awards, our Officer Corps is unreliable and does not support our diggers yet we are the reason they shine.
